Description

For the balance of the semester, you will work on your independent project, utilizing some of the alternative processes that you have learned thus far. If you haven't already begun to do so, now is time to hone in on your idea, make it your own, determine the appropriate form for your work and execute your vision.

Assignment

Draft a detailed project proposal which includes: what you will photograph (your subject), why it is of interest to you (including the ideas that your work will convey to your audience), a list of artists whose work you will look at in the context of the project and any other areas of potential research (film, painting, new media) or related ideas that you consider relevant. Your proposal should answer all the questions listed below:

• What techniques? Pinhole; cyanotype; tri-color separations; gel transfers; something else?

- Which media should I use? Black and White? Color? Digital prints or analog?
- What size is right for my piece? Scale plays an important role in the meaning of your work
- Do I need certain materials? Props? models?
- How should my piece be presented? On the wall, floor, ceiling, table, as a book, etc.

• Where should my piece be presented? What is the ultimate location for my work? We will be presenting in KTSA, mostly in LJ Gallery or Wilhelm Lobby, but some projects may lend themselves to more site-specific installations (eg, a bathroom, a hallway, a window, or even outside).

• What are possible challenges/problems for completing this project? What if I can't find subjects? What if my location is unavailable?
